

- Find the font you like
  - Download and install the font of your choice. Dot fonts can be found in the fonts folder in the Bling folder in 2019 Technology Goddesses Camp Material (Public)

  - See next page for list (you can find even more if you search the web for dot fonts)
- Download the font
- Install it

# First step

- Open PowerPoint – if it was open before you installed the font, you need to close the program and open it again
- Insert a text box
- Choose the font type and size that corresponds to the size of crystals or dome studs you have
- Type your text; you can adjust the size and font if you haven't already
- We use stones (crystals or dome studs) in size 12, 16, 20 – depending on your camp name length
- We have many sizes and colors if you want to add another design
- Make your text a mirror image by rotating 180°

# Mirror Image of Text

- You need a program where you can print a mirror image of the text – or flip it.
- Many programs can do this
- You can use PowerPoint or Word for simple text
- Or Inkscape, a free graphic program
- You cannot do this in the browser with Google Docs

# Why do you need to print in reverse?

- We will use “hot fix” crystals – the back of them has an adhesive that melts with heat to fix the crystals to the fabric
- We will use Mylar film to overlay our design and set the crystals on the design upside down
- And then iron on to the shirts
- Let’s see how this works in Powerpoint





Print at 100% - if your name is too long, split it and print separately and tape the parts together




You can change the font and size; it will stay rotated after your changes – remember to check the font size against the font table

# Final Template Steps

- Print your template out at 100%
- If it is too large, print multiple pages and tape them together; don't shrink to fit
- Your camp name must be mirror imaged
- If you have followed the font sizes, it will be pretty straight forward to set the crystals
